Seward Community Jail Information Guide

We at the Seward Community Jail understand that your stay at the jail could be an experience that you and/or your family does not understand. The following information is provided to help.

Seward Community Jail Officers are here to supervise your stay and ensure your safety. You will be expected to follow any/all verbal and written directions at all times. Failure to do so may result in the following:

-loss of good time -loss of visitation privileges

-loss of phone privileges -loss of dayroom/exercise room privileges

-additional criminal charges filed against you

- Seward Community Jail is a tobacco free facility. Tobacco and/or tobacco products will not be permitted.
- Officers cannot provide answers to any legal questions, provide any legal advise or perform any legal functions on your behalf.
- Meals are provided 3 times daily. No outside food or drink is permitted.
- Authorized medicine prescribed to you by your physician is permitted and is kept and administered by the officers. Note that no opiod/narcotic based medication is allowed, even with a prescription. Basic over the counter medication is available upon request. The inmate is responsible for any prior existing medical problems.
- Daily phone service is usually available from 9am-11pm at the discretion of the on-duty officer and unscheduled officer activity. Personal calls will be limited to 3 calls per day/15 minutes per call. Legal calls are provided at anytime at no charge upon request.
- Mail can be sent or received at any time. The Seward Community Jail does not provide postage for mail, except for correspondence with your attorney and/or the Court. All incoming and outgoing mail is inspected by the Jail Officer.
- The Seward Community Jail does not have an outdoor exercise space. An indoor dayroom/exercise room with a variety of equipment is available for inmates serving time and unsentenced inmates that have been approved by Jail Officers. The use of this room is dependent upon the discretion of the on-duty officer and is considered a privilege and can be denied if jail rules aren't followed.
- The Seward Community Jail is a temporary holding facility only. We do not hold anyone longer than 30 days.
